

Harvest Moon Organic Bakery & Sculpture Trails

Christina Chladny and Graham Thomas have created a small paradise at their home on the northern half of the Bruce Peninsula. Arriving at the end of a long wooded driveway you feel you've stumbled into a scene from a fairy tale. The house and bakery, nestled beside an apple orchard, look like little hobbit homes, earthy and welcoming.



In the late nineties Christina, a wildlife biologist, and Graham, an architect, gave up their jobs in the Northwest Territories in favour of setting up a business on the peninsula. The original venture was three-fold with a bed-and-breakfast, a community shared garden, and a bakery. After five years they downsized to focus only on the bakery. They still devotedly tend a large garden and many of their quiches, pastas, pies and pasties contain home-grown vegetables (spinach, asparagus, chard) and fruits (apples, strawberries, raspberries and rhubarb).

This is more than a trip to a country bakery. You are welcome to hike two nature trails that wind around the diverse property through fields, woods, and a class one wetland.

The trails and garden are dotted with sculptures including a totem pole, a dragon and a giant wooden mosquito.



Graham and Christina buy locally as much as possible. They get honey from **Nunya Beesness** (Ferndale), fruit from **Orchard Knoll** (Cape Chin), edible flowers from **Larkwhistle Garden** (Dyers Bay) and flour and sunflower oil from **Grassroots Organics** (Desboro). All the flours, grains, sugars, cocoa and dairy products that they use are organic. Vegan and gluten-free are always available

and they'll do special orders for other restricted diets. They offer a daily sweet and a daily savoury, and are well known for their home-made bread and 'awesome pies'.
